MEETING NOTES - The last meeting of the Illinois Spoonpluggers was held on Thursday, November 8, 2012 at the Elk Grove Village Public Library. The meeting was led by Brett Christiansen with 16 members in attendance. The next meeting will be the annual Holiday Party at Giordano's Pizzeria-Westchester on Thursday, December 13. CLUB MISSION/VISION ADOPTED - At the November meeting, the Illinois Spoonpluggers Club adopted by unanimous vote a document setting forth guiding principles for our club. These include:

Located at the corner of Cermak Road and Mannheim Road (US 12-20-45) in Westchester FISHING REPORTS - The weather cooled off quickly but has settled into an extended stable period before ice-up. Its time to make hay while it lasts! Fishing reports were again the focus of the club meeting. Gino Testone led a discussion of his successful trips this year to Mille Lacs, Lake of the Woods, and Lake Geneva catching big muskies (to 51"!) and numerous bass. Gino's maps were informative as he talked about overcoming some very rough conditions to arrive at the fish. He found that structures such as islands and humps proved to be especially productive, particularly on the cast. Scott Duff shared a detailed map he had drawn of the Illinois River near where the Fox River enters. He discussed the seasonal movements of the sauger/walleye which populate this area during the colder periods as they relate to the deeper holes and move toward the spawning areas. The map was added to the club library. Phil Szafranski boated 18-20 good size bass to 4lbs on blade baits from a casting position leading to the deepest water in the area. The spot was found after first catching a bass on a 400 Spoonplug trolling over a tapered 12' weedline. In the fall, expect the fish to be schooled in bunches in a small area. Phil reminds everyone-don't hesitate to anchor and go to the cast! Jim Perillo and Frank Cipria covered some deeper humps they had worked with success for the muskies. More recent trips to the Madison Chain yielded fish to 48". Bob Roels talked about Lake Geneva and working the JB lures to go deeper using the different rings. Brett Christianson continues to explore LOTS of new lakes this season. He went over the advantages of mapping without trolling, and casting around large features to check speeds and locate fish during the colder months. Brett has been working with John Bales and is using 3/8 oz. jigs and blades to catch his bass.

BUCK SEZ, "When casting any portion of a body of water, the fisherman is often not aware of the importance of speed control, and will not vary his retrieve speed to find the most effective one."

Buck Sez...

"When you discussed the seasonal movement of bass, and the most productive structures in the colder part of the season, you stated I should check the structure briefly that produced during the warmer part of the season. Why mess with these structures at all?"

In that study, we were trying to show the seasonal movement of bass, and to show the **most** potential structures from a seasonal point of view. You never put words in a fish's mouth by saying when and where he will be. Some structures on reservoirs are so located and so shaped, they will receive some migration all year, but most will not. Conditions could be such that the "**drop-off**" of a longer, flatter, summer-producing structure, **at the channel**, could appear little different to the fish than the deeper portions of a steeper shoreline. As you increase your knowledge of a particular structure, you will soon learn if it has possibilities in the colder part of the season. Besides, structure **near the channel** doesn't take long to "check out."

QUESTIONS FOR DISCUSSION:

- 1) Which Structure Situation(s) can be configured in this manner so as to produce movements of the bass in both warmer and colder seasons?
- 2) Can you name some bodies of water that contain this type of feature? Remember, in a natural lake "the channel" is represented by a deep hole or the basin of the lake.
- 3) **How would you fish this type of feature?** With a 4 foot weedline? With a 20 foot weedline?
