The next meeting of the Illinois Spoonpluggers will be on Thursday, April 12, 2007, 7:15 PM at the Elk Grove Village Public Library (conference room). Club meetings are held the second Thursday of the month, and a reminder, all future meetings will be held at the Elk Grove Village location.

1. **MEETING SUMMARY** - The March meeting was called to order at 7:15 PM with 11 members present. *Jim Taylor* gave the Treasurer's Report and provided an updated membership list. A room reservation issue at the library surfaced when we were again forced to relocate. The reading room we used was actually larger and quite adequate with all the needed accommodations. We may need to alternate rooms as a workable solution, although the April meeting should be back in our normal space (conference room). Final plans were made for the seminar. Members stuffed folders (agenda, program Q&A packets, and casting handouts) and *Jim Duplex*, *Rick Matus*, and *Phil Szafranski* went through a dry run of the PowerPoint presentation. Nice job, guys!

Presentation - *Scott Duff* gave a presentation of a mapping job done on a unfamiliar lake fished several years ago during a bad cold front condition. A lake map handout was presented, including "side views" for north and south portions of the lake. While above water observations were made visually; underwater information was gathered by following the major breakline all the way around the lake, drawing in shoreline features, and then using the Don Dixon approach on the structures encountered. Members exchanged ideas about how they would proceed given such a situation, in terms of mapping methods, and presentation of lures.

5. FISHING REPORTS - We're still waiting after the spring tease. Unstable conditions have been the rule. Following this winter's late freeze, we have had an exceptionally cold February, a warm spell accompanied by heavy rains, and now freezing cold again. Some extended outlooks are leaning toward another wet period in the coming weeks. Opportunities to travel to many favorite springtime spots have been limited by the high water and frequent unstable conditions. *Scott Duff* reported on two quick trips to LaSalle Lake between rainstorms and catching a decent mixed bag of LM bass, SM bass, hybrid striper, channel catfish, drum, and yellow bass. Most of the fish were caught off a couple mid-lake spots on the smaller spoonplugs, with just a few on jump lures. Media reports from Heidecke indicate that the water level is being drawn down to allow access to the north pool.

6. CHICAGOLAND SEES END OF ERA IN TACKLE BUSINESS: After 40-plus years of serving Chicago-metro anglers, Ed Shirley Sports is closing its doors. The Palatine store will be shuttered soon, as will the Countryside location. The Markham branch is now called Angler's Outlet, and the Morton Grove location will operate under the Fish Tec banner.
