- 1. MEETING SUMMARY The November meeting was called to order with 13 members present. The Treasure's Report was summarized by Jim Taylor while Jim Duplex led a discussion about possible club needs and/or purchases. These included looking into a speaker/amp for the seminar, t-shirts, and getting the VHS library tapes converted to DVD.
- 2. FISHING SUMMARY Numerous fishing reports were given. Even with the slow fishing overall there were a couple of spells where the fish were moving pretty good. Most members reported success with the muskies, pike, and some bass on Illinois, Wisconsin, and Michigan waters. Topping the list was **Bob Roels** with his 46" muskie on Madison Chain, his largest to date. Congratulations, Bob! **Rick Matus** has been on fire, too, and stressed the importance of casting this time of year to check the slower speeds including after dark, especially for the walleyes. Scott discussed how the Indian Summer type weather we have experienced stems from weather systems moving in a more "zonal" pattern, from west to east, with rather gentle movements of warm and cold air masses. Through much of November this pattern resulted in consistently above normal temperatures, and stretches of more stable weather conditions with improved fishing. Good catches of muskies reported include Rick Matus (44 1/2"), Jerry Hein (4 fish 40+"), Frank Cipria (42 1/2"), Gino Testone, and Jim Perillo. The week before Thanksgiving proved to be particularly productive. On Lake Allegan, **Scott Duff** got into a school of bass with 26 SM/LM and a 13" crappie on the cast. **Mike Lynch** has been hitting the Fox Chain where he contacted muskie, pike, and catfish. **Jim Taylor** picked up a rare, and heretofore unreported species of rockfish on the Madison Chain.
