Educational Materials

Buck Perry based all of Spoonplugging on one truth: "KNOWLEDGE IS THE KEY TO SUCCESS." Becoming an accomplished Spoonplugger requires careful study and extensive time on-the-water. To meet this need, Illinois Spoonpluggers maintains an extensive library of Educational Materials. This is one of the chief benefits of membership in the club.

Educational Materials of the Illinois Spoonpluggers are defined as:

- 1) The Club Library (maps, videos, books, newsletters, etc.),
- 2) Spoonplugger Maps
- 3) Shared Member Fishing Reports

Educational Materials in the club library are to be catalogued and kept in a safe place. Transferring of media should be accomplished as necessary to preserve content and to assure its continued availability to future members (i.e. VHS to DVD, scanning of archived printed material, etc.).

Use of Educational Materials

The club's Educational Materials are considered proprietary information, and are intended solely for use by members of Illinois Spoonpluggers for study and personal use on-the-water. Educational Materials may not be distributed outside the club, or used for personal or financial gain.

Guidelines

All library materials were either purchased with club dues or donated by club members. **Craig Hubbard** is currently administering the large volume of library information In order to continue to provide library materials to all members, we have established the following guidelines:

- 1. To reserve a video, call Craig, **847-524-9303**, and he will bring it to the next meeting.
- 2. All library items must be signed out, on loan for one month. Please provide for another club member to return library items if you miss a meeting.
- 3. If any library item is lost or damaged, the club member will pay for replacement when the item is due.

- 4. Based on our experience over the years, a few people chronically do not return items, especially videos. As a result, we have established an overdue library material section in the monthly newsletter. Overdue library items will be noted, along with the name of the club member who signed it out.
- 5. Videos are very popular library items. We allow each person to sign out two videos per month
- 6. Videos can and do wear out from high use. We need your help in this area. If a library video jams, exhibits poor tracking, bad color, or distorted sound, please alert Craig.

Take I-294 (Tri-State Toll road) north to the Eisenhower Expressway. Take the I-290 (Eisenhower Expressway) west to Exit, Biesterfield. Turn right on Biesterfield and continue east about 1 mile to Wellington. Turn right and the library is on the left: 1001 Wellington Ave.

From the east and south


Take the I-290 (Eisenhower Expressway) west to Exit, Biesterfield. Turn right on Biesterfield and continue east about 1 mile to Wellington. Turn right and the library is on the left: 1001 Wellington Ave.

From Wisconsin

Take the I-90 (Northwest Tollway) southeast to I-290 and go south to the Biesterfield exit. Go east on Biesterfield about 1 mile to Wellington. Turn right and the library is on the left: 1001 Wellington Ave. You can also exit the I-90 at Arlington Heights Rd. and go south to Biesterfield. Turn right on Biesterfield about 3 blocks to Wellington and turn left. The library is at 1001 Wellington Ave.

From Northern Illinois

Take the I-294 south, to I-90, the Northwest Tollway. Take the tollway west to Arlington Heights Rd. and go south to Biesterfield. Turn right on Biesterfield about 3 blocks to Wellington and turn left. The library is at 1001 Wellington Ave.
